God has gifted all his children. We believe that there is no division between the secular and the scared. Our kingdom work is integrated into every other part of our live which therefore also includes the "good works" God has prepared in advance for us to do (Eph. 2:10). Some may feel called to work in a Christian setting while others feel led to work in a "secular" environment. Whatever our life pathway may be, God instructs us in that... "Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for men..." (Colossians 2:23, NIV). As we seek to understand God's will and direction for our lives in preparation for serving in His harvest fields, taking inventory of our spiritual gifts can be likened to becoming <u>aware and skilled</u> in the resources God has entrusted to us. (The following survey, which will help you to begin identifying your gifts, was adapted from a profile utilized at New City Fellowship, a congregation of the Presbyterian Church in America.)

**The Spiritual Gifts definitions are listed below. The capital letter in front of the gift corresponds to the letters on your answer sheet.

Administration - The ability to organize ideas, tasks, people and time in the accomplishment of goals

Creativity - The ability to form and design ideas requiring art, skill or invention

0 Discernment - To make judgments based on perceived or recognized differences

D Exhortation/Encouragement - To instruct, comfort and/or console another with a sense of urgency.

μ Evangelism - A passion to zealously proclaim the good news of the gospel by word and deed

F. Faith - To establish moral convictions based on the truth of God's Word.

G. Giving - The desire to give of ones own resources for the benefit of another.

H. Haspitality - The desire to demonstrate friendliness, kindness and provide comfort to guests

Prayer - An act of worship that recognizes the source and therefore earnestly pleads before God's throne of grace

Leadership - The ability to embody a truth that motivates others toward the accomplishment of mutual goals

K. Mercy - To demonstrate compassion by word and deed

Wisdom - The proper application of divine knowledge, experience and understanding

M. Service - The desire to utilize our God-given abilities and gifts for the benefit of others.

N. Shepherding - Taking personal responsibility for the welfare and growth of those entrusted to our care

O. Teaching - To provide divine knowledge and wisdom by word and example for the benefit of others
